Liberal Senator, 69, and young 'air rage' wife kept relationship secret until she was 21

Maygan Sensenberger, the 23-year-old wife of a Liberal senator, is due back in court Wednesday in Saskatoon -- a domestic case that has entered the international spotlight thanks to the couple's eyebrow-raising age difference.

Sensenberger is charged with causing a disturbance on an aircraft and uttering threats against her husband, Rod Zimmer, after an



A passenger on the flight told the Saskatoon *Star-Phoenix* that Sensenberger began yelling loudly at Zimmer, saying she didn't want to meet his family in Saskatoon.

"She was threatening to slit his throat and leave him. She kept saying

she'd leave him. Everyone could hear it," the woman told the newspaper.

"He kept putting his hand on her arm to calm her down. She'd pull it away and yell that he was abusing her," the passenger said.



"(Zimmer) wasn't being aggressive toward her. He seemed embarrassed about the whole thing."

The personal lives of Canadian politicians, even ones in actual positions of power, rarely catch the public's eye. But the optics of a wealthy 69-year-old senator and his attractive 23-year-old wife has created intense interest in the personal affairs of Canadian politician virtually unknown outside of certain Ottawa circles.

Sensenbeger's Facebook pictures of the couple — vacationing in Florida, drinking, passionately kissing while their dog watches — were splashed across some of the most popular news websites around the Globe, including the U.K's *Daily Mail* and the *New York Daily News*.

Rita Sensenberger said they dated for years prior to their marriage last August, but waited until Maygan was 21 before announcing they were together.

Maygan grew up in Collingwood, Ont. and moved to Ottawa a few years ago to take classes there. She was a ballet dancer who had aspirations of acting.

Zimmer was appointed a senator in 2005 by former prime minister Paul Martin.

He was born in Saskatchewan, but called Winnipeg home.

He started his political career as an executive assistant to James Richardson, a cabinet minister under Pierre Trudeau, said Allen Mills, a politics professor at the University of Winnipeg and Zimmer's former neighbour.

Zimmer has a long private-sector resume that includes executive positions with the Manitoba Lotteries Foundation and CanWest Capital Corp. He served on several boards including the Royal Winnipeg Ballet and the Winnipeg Blue Bombers.




